About Our School

Founded in 1979 and located in the central part of Chita Peninsula, Agui High School is a prefectural full-time general senior high school and serves a diverse student body of about 1,000 students (Grade 10 – 12). Our school motto is :

剛・知・仁 (Go Chi Jin), meaning “*Train ourselves to become strong and enriched, and have love for people and our country.*”

In order for the students to achieve their individual goals, we have been focusing on individually-targeted teaching such as achievement-dependent teaching and smaller class size. International Communication Course was set up in 2005 with a goal of students being able to communicate in English.

Every year students participate in special activities such as volunteering, orienteering and swimming training. More than 1,000 students (cumulative total) participate in more than twenty types of volunteer activities. A lot of clubs take part in prefectural tournaments. Some have even participated in national tournaments.

International Communication Course

In this course, students aim for gaining the ability to communicate in English and playing an active part in the globalized Japanese society and other countries. Six features in this course include:

(A) English Summer Camp (Abroad)



Students visit Vancouver, Canada for twelve days and take some classes at a local high school. They stay with host families and join field trips with local high school students.

(B) English Summer Camp (In Japan)



Students visit Gifu for three days. They participate in various English activities in groups. The instructors are university students from the US.

(C) PCLL(Personal Computer Language Laboratory)



Students learn phrases for English conversation by using computer software in RM PCLL.

(D) Lessons by native English lecturers



Students take classes by a full-time English teacher (Canadian) and interact with an ALT (Jamaican).

(E) High School and University Collaboration



Students visit Nanzan University and take a lesson by a professor. They also attend a campus tour guided by university students. On another occasion, a professor and students visit us and give us a workshop.

(F) English Proficiency Tests



Students take some types of English Tests (e.g. Eiken(English Proficiency Test), GTEC).
